Mission Statement. Hunger Task Force believes that every person has a right to adequate food obtained with dignity. Hunger Task Force works to prevent hunger and malnutrition by providing food to people in need today and by promoting social policies to achieve food security tomorrow.

Description of Activities. Our Emergency Food Program obtains food from government, our farm, donations from individuals and businesses; we warehouse 6.6 million pounds of food per year and distribute it completely free-of-charge to 80 emergency feeding organizations and 60 senior living centers, none of whom are required to pay any membership, per-pound, or delivery fees. Our Advocacy Department organizes anti-hunger constituents and works to improve low-income households' access to nutritious food and proven support programs like food stamps, WIC, school breakfasts, lunches and summer food service programs.

Federation Activities. Hunger Task Force also administers the Hunger Relief Fund of Wisconsin, passing through workplace giving campaign gifts to a number of organizations that provide free or low-cost nutritious food to households in need. Hunger Task Force donates all administration such that every penny of all gifts to the Hunger Relief Fund are passed on to the member organizations. The Hunger Relief Fund was offered in the following workplaces during 2007: Combined Federal Campaign; City of Milwaukee Employees Combined Giving Campaign; Milwaukee County Combined Giving Campaign; Milwaukee Public Schools Combined Giving Campaign; State Employees Combined Campaign (Wisconsin).

How Costs Are Recovered from Donations. Hunger Task Force's management and general costs plus fund development costs total \$587,098, or 6 percent of expenses which is very low for a charity of our size. Hunger Task Force is unique in our area in passing on all gifts to Hunger Relief Fund of Wisconsin members with zero administration fees assessed, such that no costs need be recovered from workplace gifts directed to this federation or its members.
