
#### What is FoodShare?

- ► FoodShare is the name of the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) in Wisconsin.
- This federally funded program enables hundreds of thousands of low-income adults, children, and seniors throughout the state with funds to purchase groceries.
- → FoodShare is the state's leading anti-hunger program.

**42%** of recipients are children.





**48%** of families have at least one member who is elderly, blind or has disabilities.







For every **\$1** in FoodShare benefits, an additional **51.70** is used in the **local** economy.

Percentage of Poverty






## **Douglas County Poverty**

- Douglas has a moderate level of poverty (12.5%), ranking it 46th out of 72 counties.
- Douglas has a moderate level of child poverty (14.7%), ranking it 35th out of 72 counties.
- Douglas has a high level of senior poverty (8.5%), ranking it 51st out of 72 counties.
