

Who Uses FoodShare in Wisconsin?*









48% of families have at least one member who is elderly, blind or has disabilities.





Economic Growth

Percentage of Poverty






Eau Claire County Poverty

- Eau Claire has a high level of poverty (14.4%), ranking it 63rd out of 72 counties.
- Eau Claire has a moderate level of child poverty (12.6%), ranking it 27th out of 72 counties.
- Eau Claire has a moderate level of senior poverty (7.7%), ranking it 34th out of 72 counties.
