What is FoodShare?


- ← FoodShare is the name of the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) in Wisconsin.

children.




48% of families have at least one member who is elderly, blind or has disabilities.










Oconto County Poverty

- $\stackrel{r}{\hookrightarrow}$ Oconto has a low level of poverty (9.4%), ranking it 21st out of 72 counties.
- ℃→ Oconto has a moderate level of child poverty (12.9%), ranking it 30th out of 72 counties.
- ℃→ Oconto has a moderate level of senior poverty (8.0%), ranking it 39th out of 72 counties.
