


What is FoodShare?

Who Uses FoodShare in Wisconsin?*









48% of families have at least one member who is elderly, blind or has disabilities.




For every **\$1** in FoodShare benefits, an additional **\$1.70** is used in the **local** economy.

Percentage of Poverty





Trempealeau County Poverty

- Trempealeau has a low level of poverty (8.6%), ranking it 14th out of 72 counties.
- Trempealeau has a low level of child poverty (10.1%), ranking it 15th out of 72 counties.
- Trempealeau has a high level of senior poverty (9.3%), ranking it 58th out of 72 counties.
