


## What is FoodShare?

- This federally funded program enables hundreds of thousands of low-income adults, children, and seniors throughout the state with funds to purchase groceries.

## Who Uses FoodShare in Wisconsin?\*









**48%** of families have at least one member who is elderly, blind or has disabilities.

For every \$1 in FoodShare benefits an additional \$1.70 is used in the local economy.


## **Wisconsin Poverty**

- <sup>™</sup> Wisconsin has a moderate level of poverty of 11.9%, with individual counties ranging from 4.5% in St. Croix County to 32.8% in Menominee County.
- ₩isconsin has a high level of child poverty of 15.9%, with individual counties ranging from 4.8% in St. Croix County to 46.8% in Menominee County.
- <sup>™</sup> Wisconsin has a low level of senior (65 and older) poverty of 7.6%, with individual counties ranging from 4.1% in Pierce County to 13.2% in Vernon County.


