After struggling to make ends meet for several months, Darlene reached out for help.

orking three jobs to support her three children after a devastating divorce had pushed Darlene into hard times at age 62. Even buying food had become a challenge; Darlene had begun using a credit card for the majority of her purchases and was feeling out of control.

After connecting with Hunger Task Force, she was surprised to learn about all the programs available to help her. She now receives FoodShare, picks up a free monthly commodity box for seniors (Stockbox), shops with Senior Farmers' Market Vouchers for fresh Wisconsin produce and uses the Fresh Picks Mobile Market to get the most out of her FoodShare dollars.

A few months after receiving her new benefits, Darlene called to express her gratitude. "I'd been having some health issues," she said. "But with the help I got from Hunger Task Force, I can focus on getting better and not where my next meal is coming from."
