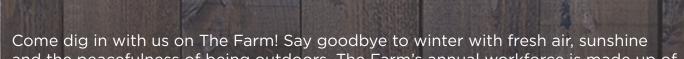

No child should go to school hungry.

Hunger takes a physical, mental and academic toll on children. Abundant research shows that hungry students have poorer academic and health outcomes. Worst of all, Wisconsin currently ranks last in the nation for schools that offer breakfast to our children.

As an advocacy organization with its roots in school breakfast for students, Hunger Task Force is turning the focus to school breakfast participation during this year's annual National School Breakfast Week, March 4-8.

WISCONSIN SCHOOL BREAKFAST CHALLENGE

Hunger Task Force is partnering with Share Our Strength's No Kid Hungry Campaign and the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to sponsor the Wisconsin School Breakfast Challenge—a contest to increase school breakfast participation for students statewide. Winning schools will be announced during National School Breakfast Week in March 2019.

TRADE MITIGATION PROGRAM

The United States Department of Agriculture is helping support American agriculture through a new program called the Trade Mitigation Program (TMP). American farmers suffered economic hardship when the foods they produced for export weren't sold to foreign markets due to trade and tariff wars. Solving two problems at once, the Federal Government bought the excess foods and is redistributing them to food banks and school meals programs to aid domestic hunger relief through TMP.

In addition to our regular allocation of emergency food, Hunger Task Force is also receiving extra semi-truckloads of fresh fruits, milk and lean meats as part of TMP. These foods then accompany our existing deliveries to Milwaukee's emergency food pantries, soup kitchens, homeless shelters and senior centers. The additional relief is helpful because many FoodShare recipients received their benefits either early or late as a result of the government shutdown. Hunger Task Force has been able to reassure the community that we have food in adequate supply and are prepared to help during this difficult time.

Still, we need support in the form of volunteers—to help distribute the food—and funds to provide refrigeration to store the extra food. Plus, our delivery team is working overtime, so we are looking for qualified drivers who have a Class A or Class B CDL! Check out the open position at HungerTaskForce.org/employment.
