
What is FoodShare?

- ← FoodShare is the name of the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) in Wisconsin.
- → This federally funded program enables hundreds of thousands of low-income adults, children, and seniors throughout the state with funds to purchase groceries.
- $\stackrel{\mathsf{r}}{\hookrightarrow}$ FoodShare is the state's leading anti-hunger program.

42% of recipients are children.




48% of families have at least one member who is elderly, blind or has disabilities.










Chippewa County Poverty

- ← Chippewa has a moderate level of poverty (10.9%), ranking it 33rd out of 72 counties.
- ℃→ Chippewa has a moderate level of child poverty (15.4%), ranking it 40th out of 72 counties.
- ℃→ Chippewa has a high level of senior poverty (8.9%), ranking it 54th out of 72 counties.
