What is FoodShare?


- Similar FoodShare is the name of the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) in Wisconsin.
- ↔ This federally funded program enables hundreds of thousands of low-income adults, children, and seniors throughout the state with funds to purchase groceries.
- ∽ FoodShare is the state's leading anti-hunger program.

children.




48% of families have at least one member who is elderly, blind or has disabilities.








Forest County Poverty

- ← Forest has a high level of poverty (16.3%), ranking it 68th out of 72 counties.
- \hookrightarrow Forest has a high level of child poverty (23.2%), ranking it 67th out of 72 counties.
- → Forest has a moderate level of senior poverty (7.4%), ranking it 30th out of 72 counties.
