


### What is FoodShare?

- This federally funded program enables hundreds of thousands of low-income adults, children, and seniors throughout the state with funds to purchase groceries.

### Who Uses FoodShare in Wisconsin?\*









**48%** of families have at least one member who is elderly, blind or has disabilities.


For every **\$1** in FoodShare benefits, an additional **\$1.70** is used in the local economy.

Percentage of Poverty





# **Marathon County Poverty**

- Marathon has a low level of poverty (9.4%), ranking it 20th out of 72 counties.
- Lafayette has a moderate level of child poverty (13.0%), ranking it 31st out of 72 counties.
- Lafayette has a moderate level of senior poverty (7.6%), ranking it 32nd out of 72 counties.
